

Loading and Operational Guidelines

Carrying cargo or pulling a trailer will affect how your TRX300 handles and greatly reduce its ability in accelerating, braking and making turns and other maneuvers.

Be sure to observe the weight limits above and follow these guidelines:

1. Do not place cargo anywhere on the TRX300 other than on the front and rear racks. Otherwise, operating stability may be adversely affected.
2. Never ride with a passenger on the front or rear cargo racks. The TRX300 is not designed to carry a passenger.
3. Do not tow another vehicle or a trailer with a rope or cable attached to the rear rack. Use the trailer hitch.
4. Load cargo on the rear rack as far forward as possible. Make sure cargo on the front rack does not interfere with handlebar movement.
5. Do not allow cargo to extend beyond the edges of either the front or rear racks.
6. Make sure all cargo is secured.
7. When towing a trailer, take care to maintain balance and stability. Distribute cargo between the front and rear of the trailer to obtain the recommended tongue weight.

NOTE:

Tongue weight can be measured with ordinary bathroom scales. Place the scales under the tongue, using either the tongue jack or other support to keep the trailer level.
