Periodic Checks		
You should also perform other periodic maintenance checks at least once a month regardless of how often you ride, or more often if you ride frequently. Also, check the odometer reading against the Maintenance Schedule and perform all maintenance that is due. ⊇ P. 34		
Tires and wheels	Check the air pressure ( $\triangleright$ P. 47), examine tread for wear and damage ( $\triangleright$ P. 47), and check the wheels for damage.	
Fluid levels	Check the engine oil level ( $\blacktriangleright$ P. 58), and brake fluid level ( $\triangleright$ P. 63).	
Lights	Check that the headlight, position light, brake light, taillight, turn signals and license plate light are working properly.	
Controls	Check the freeplay of the clutch lever ( $\triangleright$ P. 71), and throttle grip ( $\triangleright$ P. 74).	
Drive chain	Check the slack (≥ P. 67), adjust the slack (≥ P. 68), and lubricate (≥ P. 46) as needed.	
Fuses	Check that you have a full supply of spare fuses.	
Nuts & bolts	Check the major nuts and bolts, and tighten as needed.
